Minutes of meeting held April 12/92 at Beverly Town Hall

Meeting called to order at 1:35 P.M. with 21 members present and 1 guest.

The president opened the meeting by reminding the members present to not fly without there 1992 MAAC membership and don't forget to take your club card and MAAC card to the field each time you fly. We were reminded that novice day is May 2 with May 3 as the rain date.

The treasurer gave his report , there are 31 paid up members as of today and we had 42 members last year. The bank balance is \$847.00 and the \$500.00 field fee has not been paid as of today.

The minutes of the last meeting were read . Moved by Allan Hillborn and seconded by Albert Fund that the minuets be accepted as read. Passed.

It was suggested that the fall meetings be on October 4 and December 13 if the hall is available.

The cards mentioned at the last meeting have been made and were handed out to members present. Don't forget to hand these out to interested people.

The plaques mentioned in the last meeting has been taken care of by the usual source.

The winch discussion has been deferred to the fall .

Clyde Halford, lawyer, was present to give us a discussion on incorporating and what the ramifications are for not incorporating. The main advantage for incorporating is that it limits the liability of club members to the extent of the assets of the club, in the event that litigation is brought against the club for any reason. If the club is not incorporated the litigated damages could be to the extent of the assets of the individual members whether that member was involved in the reason for the litigation or not .

The approximate costs are

A motion was made that we have a special meeting on May 3 at 1 P.M. if the hall is available and time be set at 3 P.M. if the novice day on May 2 is rained out. Moved by Bill Woodward seconded by Fred Freeman . Passed.

It was also suggested that a notice of a special notice be sent out to all members and former members going back to at least 1989, and that the notice spell out the reasons for the concern that more protection be obtained for the members.

Stan Shaw moved and Bill Woodward moved that the meeting be adjourned.

Minutes of special meeting held May 3, 1992 at the Beverly Town Hall.

The meeting was called to order at 1.30 P.M. with 21 members present.

It was suggested that a fee of \$25.00 for each member would be needed to carry out the incorporation. It was also suggested that all new members be charged an initiation fee of this same amount to be put in a special fund against future litigation. In any event the \$25.00 would be a one time payment.

There was a concern that this may detour junior members so the discussion ended with a consensus that junior members not have to pay the incorporation fee but would have to pay the initiation fee when they became full members.

There will have to be a new constitution drawn up and many of the items discussed here will be in that document. The lawyer will guide use on this item.

Moved by Stan Shaw and seconded by Bud Wallace that the club become incorporated as soon as the funds are collected. Voted on and passes unanimously.

Each name will be searched.

Moved by Al Hilborn and seconded by Kevin Skerrit that the meeting be adjourned. Passed by vote at 1.50 P.M.

**NOVATHON**  
August 9th, 1992

We had hoped for good weather for this contest, but were obliged to cope with wind that gusted at times to 25km under threatening skies. Fortunately, for the 16 contestants, no rain fell but it was indeed very cool and damp.

Influenced, perhaps, by the somewhat variable conditions, the less experienced fliers tended to choose the "straight time" task as opposed to the potentially higher scoring "Novathon" task. (ed note...the novathon task is designed such that precision duration with landings on exactly the odd minutes 1,3,5 & 7 yield substantially higher scores than the 1 point per second straight time task.) We had decided at the outset that this would be a flying contest and not a landing contest. There were no landing points! Some contestants liked this, some didn't.

Udo Rumpf put his stamp on this quite early with consistently high times right through the fifth round. He was followed very closely by the S.O.G.G. pair of Werner Klebert and Joe Baltaza. That was the order in which they finished. Others in the hunt were Norm Klebert and Bill Moar. Stout efforts were turned in from S.O.G.G. novices Al Hilborn and David Woodhouse in their first tastes of competition. (ed note...I finished 5 rounds and didn't break the plane. A real first in my books. Somebody has to finish last...watch out Al!) The day was marred by two "incidents". Zivko Rizoniko fell victim to radio interference (ed note...make sure the channel/frequency on your "PIN" matches that of the radio you bring to the contest and your pin goes on the right spot on the frequency board.) and Al Hilborn who discovered that the "Terra" was indeed "Firma" in spite of all that rain after posting his best time of the day in the fourth round of the contest.

All things considered, it was an enjoyable outing. We thank the participants and look forward to seeing you next year.
